Language of instruction	English
Language requirement	Exchange students from non-English medium institution are required to submit either the TOEFL or IELTS result if they are applying to read modules from NUS Faculty of Law. http://www.nus.edu.sg/registrar/edu/ng.html#general
Language courses	Students can take any of the language courses offered by the Centre for Language Studies subject to qualification and availability. Students are required to provide a certification letter from home university to declare their level of proficiency in the language(s).

Modular System	A programme leading to a 3 year Bachelor's degree requires a minimum of 120 MCs. As such, the usual load for NUS students is 16 to 20 modular credits (MCs) per semester, where 1 MC is equal to 2.5 hrs of study and preparation per week. A 4-MC module would require 10 hours of work a week, including lectures, tutorials, laboratory sessions, assignments, and independent or group study. http://www.nus.edu.sg/registrar/edu/modular.html
